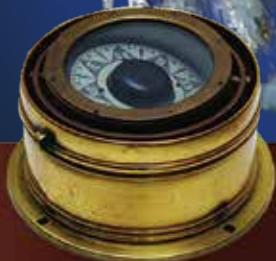

- *Invent, plan, design, cut, stitch, sew or sculpt, paint, stick, weave, weld, knit, bind, bolt, glue*

Fabric, leather, cardboard, wool, plastic, harakeke, foam, recovered items, fibre, beads, glass, clay, metal, shells, bone, vinyl, linen, jute, wire -

ALL ENTRIES MUST BE YOUR VERY OWN ORIGINAL ART AND MUST INCLUDE VISIBLE AND OBVIOUS TARTAN

This can be *painted, engineered, stitched, woven, knitted, reconstructed* – anything goes!

2021 SECTIONS

THINKING OF ENTERING?

Here are the key dates that you need to know:

- ❑ 16th June 2021 Early Bird Registration with completed Entry Form \$20.00
- ❑ 26th July 2021 Last day to complete and pay for your entry.
- ❑ 29th August 2021 Pre Judging day (THIS IS WHEN YOUR COSTUME IS TO BE FINISHED!)
- ❑ 14th October 2021 Dress Rehearsal – all entrants are required
- ❑ 15/16th October 2021 **SHOW TIME!** Friday night show, Saturday matinee and night show.

After pre judging there will be a requirement for models to attend training and choreography. Dates and times to be advised closer to the time.

INFORMATION AND CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

1. Waipu Museum Art'n Tartan Awards (Covid 19 Level 1 permitting) will be held on October 15/16 2021 in the form of three shows, Friday evening, Saturday matinee and Awards Night Saturday evening.
Preliminary Judging will be held on Sunday 29th August. Entries must not be altered after that date
2. You may enter as many garments as you like. Entry forms must be submitted by 26 July 2021 with design completed by Preliminary Judging day. Entry fees are non-refundable except where an entry is not accepted. All entries must be original and not copies of any other wearable art. We reserve the right to refuse an entry.
3. Garments must be able to be worn continuously for up to 3 hours. Models must be able to move freely, see, breathe and negotiate stairs or ramps.
4. Entries may be created from any medium other than perishable materials.
5. Each entry must be on a separate form. Submit to Waipu Museum, 36 The Centre, Waipu 0510 or art'ntartan@gmail.com by 26 July 2021.
6. Entry Fees are \$20.00 per entry for the Early Bird special, and \$35.00 per entry for all entries submitted after 16 June. Bank account details are 06 0479 0012627 00.
7. The definition of tartan can be found in a dictionary or on the internet.
8. The Supreme Award will only be given to a full body costume.
9. Wearable Art previously shown anywhere other than in Kaipara, Whangarei or the Far North may enter Art'nTartan.
10. The judges' decisions will be final.
11. The artworks will be judged with equal weighting across five criteria:
 - Artistic Vision including the synergy between your artwork and your artist statement
 - Creativity & Originality
 - Innovative Use of Materials
 - Quality of Craftmanship and Construction
 - Visual Impact from all angles
12. Models need to be confident, move well and be aware of the essence of the artwork they are modeling. Art'n Tartan will endeavour to provide models if the designer does not have one. Contact Glennie at glenniekknits@gmail.com. Models must be available for Preliminary Judging Day on 29 August and rehearsals on 13 & 14 October. The same model must be used for Preliminary Judging, all rehearsals and the Shows themselves.
